WIC Qualifications

WIC is for all kinds of families: married and single parents, working or not working. If you are a father, mother, grandparent, foster parent or other legal guardian of a child under five, follow these guidelines to see if you can apply for WIC:

- * Live in Colorado
- * Are pregnant or breastfeeding, and/or have a child under five years of age
- * Meet household income guidelines (check the QR code below)



WIC Breastfeeding Support

- S**pecially trained staff who can help women reach their breastfeeding goals.
- B**reastfeeding peer counselors who have personal breastfeeding experience and offer around-the-clock support.
- A** breast pump loan program for qualifying women with several pump options.
- F**ree breastfeeding classes with information and resources .
- F**ree community support groups in the north and south metro area.
- G**rocery store vouchers to support nutritional needs while breastfeeding.
- B**reastfeeding support 24/7 at tchd.org, Facebook, and Pinterest .
