- Chicken Pox (Varicella)
- Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B
- Japanese Encephalitis
- Malaria
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
- Pneumococcal and Meningococcal Meningitis
- Polio
- Rabies
- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis
- Typhoid Fever
- Yellow Fever

Office visit fees and the price of individual vaccines are very cost-effective. Some vaccines take 2-4 weeks to provide protection, so plan ahead!
