

### **At-Home COVID-19 Testing**

You and your healthcare provider might consider either an at-home testing collection kit or an at-home test if you have symptoms of COVID-19 and if you cannot get tested at a healthcare clinic. At-home COVID-19 test kits allow you to self-collect a nasal swab or saliva sample at home and, depending on the test, are available either by prescription or over the counter in a pharmacy or retail store without a prescription.

Prior to ordering, check with your insurance company about coverage of at-home test kits. At-home test kits can range in price from \$25-\$225.

There are [two types of home tests](#) available that are collected with either a nasal swab or saliva sample. The rapid antigen test gives results in 15 minutes, and the PCR test is mailed to the lab where on average 72 hours from receiving your sample the results are posted. Some test kits require that you complete an online medical screening questionnaire to determine eligibility for the test, or conduct a telehealth visit with a medical provider.

Since there are different types of at home test kits, make sure you do your research to determine which test is right for your needs. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) [At-Home Testing webpage](#) has information about collecting specimens, performing the test, reporting results and what to do after receiving your results.
